Estimation Manager


The launch of the Estimation Manager is delayed by just one week, and will be on Saturday the 21st. I wanted to make a few more tweaks to it, plus I promised that you'd have access to a YouTube video tour prior to launch. I will upload the video on Tuesday the 17th at the latest.

Scheduling: Events

One of the requested changes from our User Meeting was a longer description field for events. The length has been increased from 512 characters to 2048.

Notes

Users asked for a way to handle Daily Reports. In response, SMMware has added "Notes Templates". When you create a new note, you can have some header labels already in place, showing employees exactly what information they are expected to include in the note. Each of the places where you can enter a Note has its own template (Jobs, Clients, Organizations, Contacts, and soon Estimates), and they can all be managed in the Settings Editor.



Side note: Most employees will cooperate in filling out all the fields. But if you do have an employee who might be inclined to delete a field they don't feel like filling out, we suggest numbering the fields as a way of making such changes more obvious and discouraging claims of accidental alteration.

Login Bugfix

SMMware has been fixed for a bug affecting logging in, such that if you mistyped your username or password, the same bad info was preserved and submitted again even though you might have corrected them.

Background: When you hit 'Save' on a page after your login session times out, SMMware will preserve all the information you had put in the page, allow you to log in, and then complete the 'Save' process. You don't have to retype all your info into the page. This capability is very useful, but when I added it I accidentally also preserved the (possibly incorrect) username and password if you were logging in. My apologies for any frustration you may have experienced from this bug, but be assured that it is now squashed.
